Dear members and friends, I would like to mention some of the things going on at the HJCI. Our 70th year anniversary fundraising campaign has enabled the replacement of the 9 large windows in the Social Hall. A generous donation by the late Miyuki Ichinose made this work possible last summer. But the most significant improvement is the repaving of the upper area parking lot and adjacent areas. For me, It has been 20 years that I have waited to see this area repaved. Now since we have re-paved it we can have our pancake breakfast on a smoother safer surface. Many of our older members had a hard time walking on the crumbling and cracked asphalt and uneven steps.

The Cultural Institute was lucky to find a great landscape contractor, Mr. Ken Nakano, who provided the plan, oversight, and completion of the project within a feasible budget. Please stop by and take a look at this work. Long standing drainage problems around the building are also being repaired. Pedestrian safety was also improved by eliminating / repairing some uneven steps from the lower to upper parking lot.

By the time you read this message, you will have probably enjoyed our famous pancake breakfast fundraiser on 9-24-17. AIKIDO DOJO (合気道道場)

New "Soto Deshi", Martin Weber

I met Lia Sensei on her European tour in Bonn, where she stayed for three days. The first time I saw her was watching her give teens-class. It was a great joy watching her. She had them running, rolling, doing techniques and laughing. I was able to feel the energy from outside and I saw the kids sweating. These two aspects proved to be very similar to the adults-classes over the next three days.

Her warm up was typically traditional. During class, every time she showed a technique she did so with several "ukes", so that many of the participants were able to feel her way of leading the "uke" through the technique and holding the contact without any physical power. After this first lesson on Friday in Bonn I decided to follow her not only the rest of the weekend, but also to her seminar in Duesseldorf. Some evenings we got together at a restaurant with big groups and she told stories of her 10-year stay in Japan as an "uchi deshi" of Takeda Shihan. All the training days, the joy during the classes and her positive nature made me decide to follow her a bit longer to her dojo in Los Angeles to learn all these interesting deeper aspects of aikido that she showed us during her stay. My aim is to concentrate for a while **only** on aikido and find a deeper connection to it. I am sure that I will leave her future classes the same way I left the last ones: sweating and smiling.

70th YEAR FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Asao Masumiya, 70th F.C: Chairperson

A big thank you to HJCI's supporters and friends who made donations from February 1st through September 10th. Please refer to the February Newsletter for donation acknowledgements from November 1st, 2016 through January 31st, 2017. Past newsletters are available through Hollywood JCI's website).

To date, the total donations received is approximately \$49,000 toward our original goal of \$70,000. The campaign funds have been utilized to replace the 9 large windows in the Social Hall (made possible by the generosity of the late Miyuki Ichinose) and toward replacement of the parking and walkway areas in front of the Social Hall building. Current projects taking place include replacement of the old chain link fencing with a wrought iron fence along the front of the property on Middlebury St.

In addition, prep and painting work has begun on the exterior of the 2 story Multipurpose (MP) building that houses the judo dojo and classrooms. The MP building was built in 1994 when it was last painted.

Thanks to your generous donations and care of the HJCI, these improvements are possible! Other improvements will be made as our budget permits.

Community Unites for Terasaki Budokan Groundbreaking

On August 3, 2017, LTSC began a new chapter in the campaign to bring a multipurpose sports facility and community center to Little Tokyo. A large crowd of supporters, funders, lenders and elected officials gathered on the future site of Budokan for the long awaited groundbreaking ceremony. The event featured stirring words from numerous contributors to the project, taiko and ukulele performances and an aikido demonstration by Consul General Akira Chiba.

“Today is truly a remarkable occasion,” said LTSC Executive Director Dean Matsubayashi, “an achievement, a celebration and a major milestone in our long journey to build a community recreation center in Little Tokyo.” Budokan construction will begin in late-September and completion of the project is expected in 2019. LTSC continues to seek contributions to stay on target. The organization will shift into phase two of its fundraising, an endowment campaign to ensure the ongoing sustainability of the facility.
